CHECK-IN TIME for all sites: 4 pm
CHECK-OUT TIME for all sites: 11 am

Quiet Hours **From: 10:30pm - 8am**

- All sound/music/electronic devices and generators must be turned off during quiet hours as not to disturb other campers (keep voices low)
- During the day noise must be contained within your site
- Offensive behaviour/loud music is not allowed at any time
- Zero tolerance for parties

TENTS/UNITS must be registered with the office prior to arrival

- Only select sites permit the use of extra tents/units
- all extra tents/units MUST be on the gravel and not in the trees/grass.
- Max capacity restrictions must be adhered to.
- Children under the age of 13 sleeping in an extra tent must be accompanied by an adult

No Smoking

No smoking of tobacco or cannabis in tipis, trapper's tents, Trading Post or washrooms. If disregarded, a \$100 cleaning fee will be applied to the credit card on file. ALCOHOL and CANNABIS may only be consumed on your designated site; do not carry around the campground.

All pets must be registered, leashed, well behaved , under control and with you at all times.

Leashes/extendable ropes must be kept under 10 feet at all times. Pets cannot be left unattended in tents. Leashes cannot be dragging or loose. It is illegal not to have your pet restrained and under control at all times as per provincial park laws. Pets are not permitted in or around tipi sites, in the Trading Post or in washrooms. We reserve the right to require immediate removal of any pet that displays dangerous or unacceptable behaviour, including, but not limited to: biting, excessive noise/barking or evidence of disease. Your account will be charged for the repair or replacement cost for any damage caused by your pet.

It is forbidden to store any coolers/food/ attractants/garbage inside the trapper's tent, tipi or personal tent.

All guests must abide by the Bear Safety & Food Rules in Alberta Parks. Fines start at \$250.

Attractants: food, coolers, beverage containers (empty and full), garbage and any items with a strong odour such as toiletries, candles and pet food. These items must be stored in a closed hard-sided vehicle when not in use/ if you're inside your tent/ gone for a walk/ or at night. It is ILLEGAL not to do so. (Report bear / fox sightings to 403.591.7755)

- Put all waste food and garbage in sealed GARBAGE BAGS - these must go into the BEAR-PROOF BINS
- Do NOT leave food/ garbage in your firepit
- Items may be removed for your safety and others' - if staff must bring attractants to the office, a \$30 pickup fee will be charged

If Alberta Parks Conservation Officers remove the attractants - you will have to drive to pick up your items and pay a larger fine starting at \$250

Obey the speed limit: 15km/hour

Please watch for children playing. All terrain vehicles/ dirt bikes not allowed.

It is illegal in Alberta Parks to cut/damage trees or to pick flowers

Fines start @ \$250.00. You may bring firewood as long as it is from Alberta or bought at the Trading Post.

It is also prohibited to attach items to trees.

Campfires are permitted in designated firepits only

Do not leave unattended. No fireworks/crackers allowed. Always ensure there are no fire restrictions prior to lighting a campfire.

Keep valuables locked in the trunk of your vehicle.

Please do not re-arrange any of the furniture. Leave everything as you found it.

Visitors are only permitted for single bookings of 1-2 sites between the hours of 9 am and 9 pm

Unfortunately, due to capacity restrictions visitors are NOT permitted for group bookings (3+ sites). All visitors must register themselves and their vehicles at the Trading Post upon arrival. The number of visitors may not exceed site capacity restrictions.

Heater and lantern instructions are posted in each Trapper's Tent/Tipi

Please try starting your heater/lantern on arrival. If you need assistance you must speak with a staffer at the Trading Post before 6 p.m.

Sites unoccupied for more than 24 hours are considered vacant unless the office is notified of your absence beforehand.

Dishwashing must be done at your site using a wash basin

DO NOT wash dishes at the water well or in the washrooms. Scrape all food scraps and grease off of dishes into a garbage bag BEFORE washing. Dispose of garbage bags into bear proof garbage bins as soon as possible. Grey water from dishwashing may be spread out over a wide area in the bushes.

Trails along the river are UNSupervised

River banks are undercut in places. Extreme caution is required.

Filming and photoshoot policy

- Drones/commercial/sponsored photography and/or video shoots are NOT permitted at Sundance Lodges without express written permission from management
- Guests may shoot non-commercial photography or video for their own personal use (with no drones or professional equipment, lighting, etc.) at their site or on the property but must respect the privacy and well-being of other guests in the area
- Professional photography/videography will only be allowed if management has given their permission before the shoot
- All photography/ videography requests will be reviewed and approved based on occupancy, availability and content

Campground management has full authority to enforce these rules at any time.

We reserve the right to refuse service to anyone who behaves in a verbally abusive or bullying manner at any point during the business transaction or during the stay itself, towards any Sundance employees or guest(s) on the property.
